 - Sentinel node mapping, pelvic, retroperitoneal, para aortic lymphadenectomy
- Laparotomy/ Open Approach
 - Cold knife cone
 - Colposcopy
 - D&C with or without hysteroscopy
 - o Excision of vaginal mass
 - Exploratory laparotomy
 - Full or partial vaginectomy
 - Laparotomy resection and or open excision of pelvic mass/malignancy, omentectomy, staging
 - Laser of cervix, vulva and vagina
 - Ovarian cancer primary or interval debulking/resection, staging



Procedures

- Total abdominal hysterectomy bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy
- Wide local excision of vulvar mass
